EDUCATION, EMPLOYMENT AND TRAINING BURSARY

What is the EET Bursary?

The EET Bursary helps to cover the cost for Education, Employment and Training, which will have a positive effect on a young person's career. Applications can take up to six weeks to be processed, so please apply in advance.

Eligibility:

We **cannot** support applications of young people who:

- Have rent arrears over £500
 - > Young people with rent arrears over £500 must provide evidence that they have signed a repayment plan, and have stuck to the repayment agreement for a minimum of eight weeks.
- Are applying for costs related to asylum and visa applications.

What can we provide?

- We can cover training course fees:
 - > The course must be provided by a legitimate institution and must have a clear link to their goals.
 - > Young people that are eligible for the Advanced Learner's Loan should follow this route.

- Books and stationary for the education/training course
 - > Courses will usually provide a required reading list or essential items list which the bursary team will consider
 - > The essential items list must be given by the learning institution
 - > If there is no list, but there is an item you need, the bursary team will consider it as long as it is a reasonable request.
- Clothing that is needed for training/education:
 - > Some sectors require specialist clothing.
 - > The young person may be asked for proof that clothing item is required
 - > For some jobs and apprenticeships, formal work wear will be required, the amount rewarded will be given by the bursary team
- Computing equipment needed for training and education:
 - > The bursary may grant a new laptop to students studying at a Level 3 or above. The laptops do not come with Microsoft office, but will be set up with Open Office.
- Specialist equipment, such as tools, chef knives and makeup kits may be needed for different courses.
 - > Specialist equipment can be funded if a young person has provided proof in application.
- Travel for work, college or university
 - > College and other courses: We provide unlimited travel awarded every three months or every month depending on the circumstance. Young people must have proof of attendance over 70% to be awarded travel.
 - > Apprenticeships: also receive unlimited travel awarded monthly or every three months, and must provide evidence from their employer that they are engaging in the course.
 - > Work: Bursary will only award one month of travel in the first month of a young person starting their job
 - > In special circumstances: Bursary will reimburse the costs of travel the young person has already incurred.
